### **French Trip**



The last week of the summer holidays is fast becoming the "French Trip Week" and this year marks our fifth visit to the Chateau de la Baudonnière which was as successful as ever.

The party included pupils from Years 7 and 8 and we all spent a happy, productive and highly educational week in a French environment, learning and practising new skills.

The trip is extremely popular and it can now be said that over 90% of our current Year 8 pupils have been on a French Trip during their time in senior prep. The Château sits in a parkland setting and boasts a lake and forest in deepest Normandy. It caters for school groups and offers an all round activity programme which is combined with total immersion in the French language. Activities include photography, orienteering, bread making and the infamous muddy assault course. Excursions included a visit to the walled town of Dinan, with a clock tower that dates back to the 15th century, and Mont-Saint-Michel, a rocky islet with a famous gothic Abbey.

At all times we were totally immersed in the French language, whether in oral classroom sessions, communicating around the Château, during activities or at mealtimes. Our pupils had the assistance of "animateurs", who took every opportunity to engage them in conversation.

### **Science at Brandeston**





There have been many highlights this year for the Science department. Most notable were the Science Common Entrance results with 41% of pupils in Year 8 achieving A and A\* grades.

Another important event of the year was Science week which included trips to Jimmy's farm, Colchester Zoo and the Science and Natural History Museum. Back at school we had visits from the 'Nite Owls' for pupils from Nursery through to Year 8; Michael Doy a local beekeeper gave a very informative talk on his passion for bees and Suffolk county council carried out recycling workshops for Years 2 - 4. In addition, Martin Rapley, the 'Bug man' arrived with his menagerie of snakes, toads, frogs, newts and lizards and introduced a 'hands on sessions' to all pupils.

There were also river studies, volcanoes and cola bottles exploding. Marble runs, spaghetti, marshmallow and straw tower challenges were battled out. Kaleidoscopes, clocks and foam gliders were constructed and nature art and slime made.



And finally, in the Black and White Hall, we had chicks hatching out and growing at a quite phenomenal speed. All 11 chicks have now been adopted by 3 very excited Year 8 girls.

The pupils were given a variety of ingredients and had 15 minutes to prepare a main course in front of their friends. The Red team, led by Head Boy Charlie Green, produced a dish of chicken in a tomato ragu sauce with wilted greens and pasta. Meanwhile the Green team, who were captained by Amanda Birch, prepared a vegetable balti, Indian spiced potatoes and pilau rice. To help decide which way they should vote, a number of pupils were chosen from the audience and given the opportunity to be food critics and tasters. Throughout the presentation the emphasis was on eating a balanced and healthy diet, while demonstrating how much fun cooking can be, even at 12. The Red team were the winners by the narrowest of margins and the pupils were able to sample the two dishes which were served at lunchtime.
